

INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITIES:

The policy of the Institution is to rise and augment infrastructural facilities to cater to the growing needs in the teaching - learning process. Such an effort would bring the benefit of better value for funds, enhanced quality service and increasing efficiency. The college has adequate infrastructural facilities to run the academic and administrative programmes. The college campus spreads over 37 acres (Built-up area: 8361.2736 Square Meters) of serene eco friendly academic ambience. Catering to their needs, the Institution has met with horizontal and vertical growth, flourishing well with Under Graduate, Post Graduate and Research Programmes.

The institution has sufficient number of Class rooms, Library, Laboratories, Seminar Hall, Auditorium, Canteen and Playgrounds. As the number of courses offered in the College increases, requirement for additional class room also increases. To meet this demand the Management sanctions sufficient funds. New infrastructure is created and the existing ones are upgraded whenever necessary. Stable and proper maintenance of infrastructure has helped the optimal usage of existing facilities.

The institution has spacious, well- ventilated and adequately furnished classrooms. Each class is provided with fan, LED bulbs, light, adequate seating facilities. 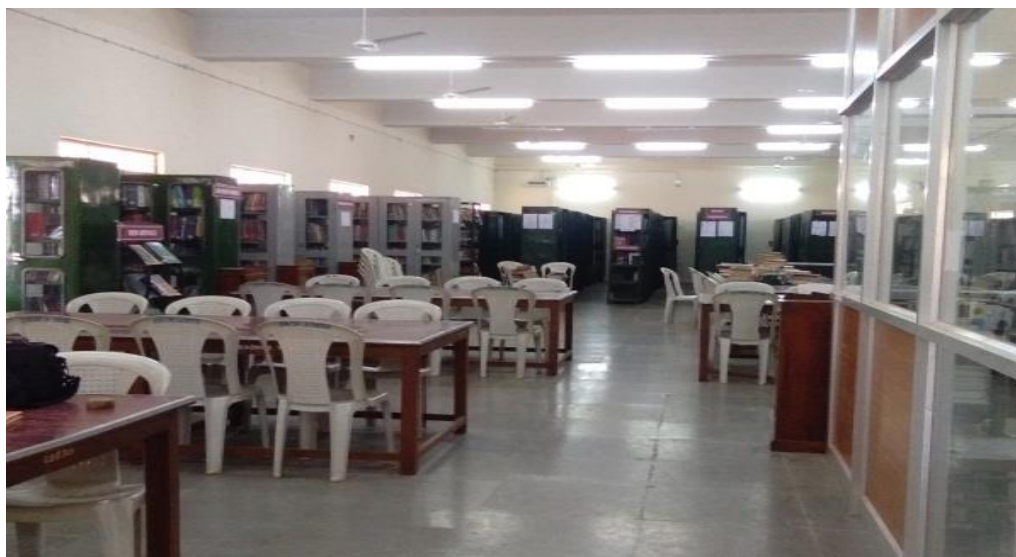

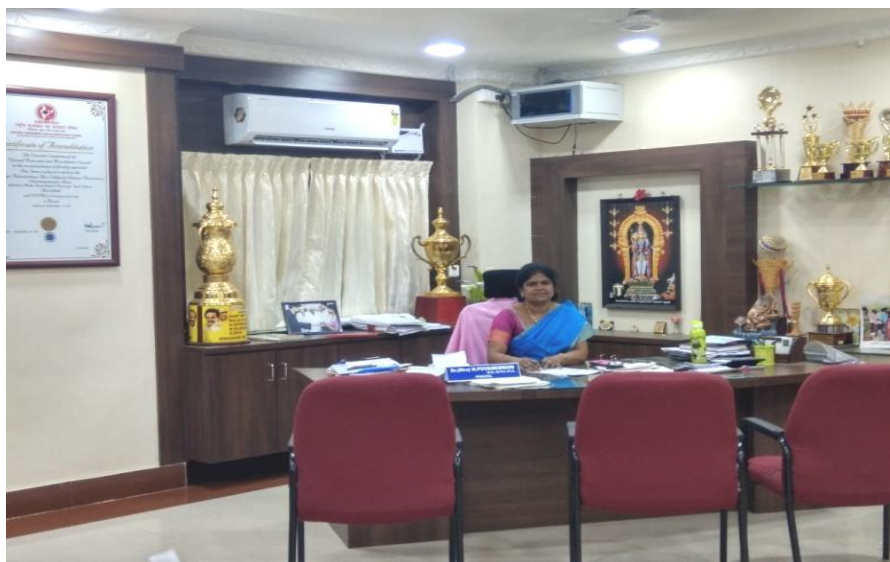


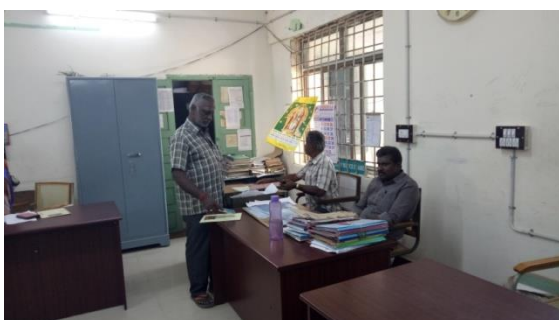
Administrative Block:

The administrative block is meant for conducting high-level meetings of the Governing Body of this institution. The Correspondent and the Secretary of the college attend the general meetings and hold discussions with the Principal by making their presence in the Administrative block.

Principal Office:

The office is adjacent to the Principal room. The non-teaching staff of this institution are allotted the official works as well as some of them serve as laboratory assistants. The staffs are administered by the Principal and the Superintendent. The office is well-furnished with sufficient furniture, computers, printers and Internet facility.





Staff Room:

There are totally 12 Staff rooms, meant for the faculty of each department separately. The staff rooms vary in size, depending on the strength of the faculty. The departments own White boards, interactive boards, LCD projector and podium. The entire campus is connected with intercom facility for quick and easy contact. There are separate rest rooms for students, teaching faculty and male staff members.



Canteen:

A canteen, run on lease to accommodate about 50 students is available in the campus. Refreshments and food items are sold at subsidized rates. An Advisory committee,

comprising the Principal, four representatives from faculty and the canteen manager monitors the functioning of the canteen and assesses the quality of the food items.



Auditorium & Seminar Halls:

An Auditorium with 2500 seating capacity with high-tech audio-system was constructed in 2017 by the management. There are two seminar halls with LCD projectors. They are fully furnished and maintained well to facilitate the conduction of Examinations Seminars, Conferences and other academic meets.



Internet Facilities:

The institution makes a variety of IT resources available to its members. They include all computer networks, wired or wireless, computers, printers, mobile devices, storage, audio visual systems, and associated information services. The resources are availed for the purpose of research, teaching, learning, associated administration or other authorized use. Some such optimal uses are -

- The institution provides secure, network connections to all rooms on the main site, which enables members to access the service at various strategic areas within the College.
- There are well-equipped computer laboratories, with scanners and printers (Laser and Dot Matrix), and a number of public access points in convenient locations around the College. It provides computing facilities to help the students with their academic work.
- The institution ensures a consistent computing environment, by upgrading the IT facility available in the campus from 128 kpbs to 2mpbs version.
- All departments have computer facilities, with PCs, offering a range of general and specialist software, as well as printers and scanners.
- The Institution has established fully equipped ICT enabled class rooms which are used extensively for teaching, paper presentations, demonstrations etc.
- The Department of Computer Science and Computer Applications provides a Help Desk service to all College members. This includes help and advice on computing issues and a limited disaster recovery service to help users get data back if their own computers fail.
- To enable efficient dissemination of information and communication the Institutional website has been registered in the free domain and properly activated.
- The faculty and the students use Laptops, LCD Projectors, Over-head Projectors, Web tools and Online resources at times of academic need.
- Network Resource Centre is functioning in the College with 10 computers.
- Public Addressing system and Intercom facility are added advantages for easy dissemination of information.

- As the institution adheres to the Single Window Counseling System for admission from 2015-16, exclusive software is launched by the computer experts to make the work easier and transparent.
- The server 'moodlecloud.com' speeds up the academic endeavours of the students of this institution, by providing E-content materials prepared by the faculty, Computer aided packages and introduction to Online Service Examinations.
- e-pay roll System – Online: Pay bill are prepared by the staff with the assistance of the software 'nic' and other bills clearance is done by 'Electronic Clearing System'.
- The application for scholarship by the students is done online through 'Tamilnadu E-district Scholarship System'.
- All the Income Tax related matters are dealt with easily and correctly by the launching of software in the office.
- Library automation and data base is created in the college library by installing the software 'E-granthalaya'. LAN Facilities are made available in the library.
- Mobile LCD projectors with suitable accessories ensure intact usage of ICT tools whenever necessary in all departments.
- The whole campus is brought under the CCTV surveillance, with 54 cameras to ensure the security of the students.

The institution uses only the licensed software, with the computers, well-protected with K7 Anti-virus package. Information Technology needs to serve its users as best as possible and to take the role of an enabler, fostering innovation. So, the infrastructure is continuously upgraded. The institution is sure to invest in Information Technology still more in order to serve our students still better.

Examination Section:

The examination section of this institution functions in a separate wing in Building – II. It has been divided into two big rooms – one for doing the official work and the second one is fully automated and used for highly confidential examination-related works.

Yoga Centre:

For keeping stress at bay and to enable the students to tolerate the potential stress associated with life, the college organizes a physical exercise and yoga session once in a week for freshers and hostelers and helps them to maintain harmony of body and spirit. It also increases attention span, improves memory and sharpens the focus of the students. It is

also prolific for stress reduction, and emotional wellness. Every year the college conducts Yoga and Meditation classes for freshers. There is a separate Meditation Hall available in the hostel. Co-operative Store:

The timely disposal of waste is necessary for a clean campus. The college maintains waste management system which includes recycling of drained water for garden maintenance.

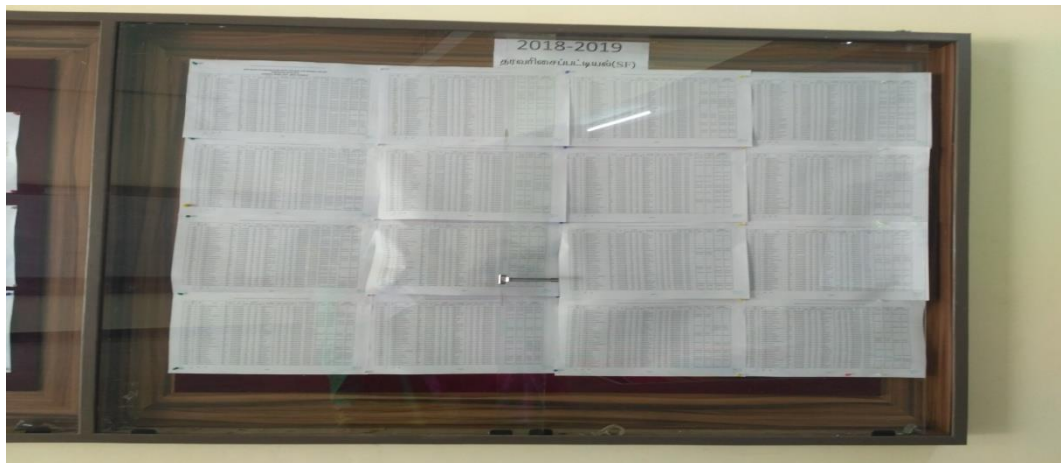


Rain Water Harvesting System:

**Generators :**

There are two generators, with the power of 7.5 KVA and 15 KVA are available in the campus.

Parking Area:

There is a closed parking area for two wheelers and an open parking area for heavy vehicles available in the campus.

**Water Supply:**

Four bore-wells and one well at different points in the campus exist to provide necessary supply of water. In addition, the management has made arrangement for water supply through water trucks. To provide purified drinking water to the students there is a water Purifier with 500Litre capacity in the college and another in the hostel. There are 10 RO Water Purifiers in the departments, office, Examination Section.



Medical Facilities:

Each Department is provided with a medical kit to attend to the needs of the sick students. At times of emergency, the college uses the 108 Ambulance facility to give the timely attention to the affected. The Social Welfare Department of the Government of Tamilnadu supplies sanitary napkins to the students of this college, to keep up their personal hygiene. Under the National Service Scheme, the gynecologists are invited to do medical check-up to the faculty, the women staff and the students.

Transport:

The management runs two buses for staff and students. The State Transport Corporation provides special trips to the college students both in the morning and the evening.





Other Infra-Structure Facilities:

- Fire extinguisher is installed in Chemistry laboratory and library.
- The institution has a great concern for the improvement of infrastructure as it is a catalyst for effective function.
- The College campus is maintained as plastic free zone.

Sports Facilities:

The progression of the college in the field of sports has been both consistent and remarkable. The students participate in District, Inter Collegiate Tournaments, and Inter University Tournaments and bring laurels to our college.
