- **Curriculum Development:** Maintaining the curricular quality and its relevance by developing and upgrading the autonomous setup.
- **Teaching, Learning and Assessment:** Maintaining educational quality by appointing faculty members on schedule. Following the academic calendar.
- Improving Teaching-Learning with ICT: Making use of LCD projectors, advertising Learning Management Systems (LMS), and e-learning materials.
- **Promoting Research**: Encouraging academic members to conduct research.
- Workshops/Seminars: Planning seminars on innovative industry-academia practices and Intellectual Property Rights (IPR).
- **Consultancy Services:** Making revenue by providing free services to particular community groups, such as school children and tribe members.
- **Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs):** Expanding partnerships with organizations and businesses for project work, internships, on-the-job training and research facility sharing.
- Facilities and Infrastructure: Infrastructure augmentation includes maintaining and updating existing structures, as well as setting aside funds for and routinely meeting the needs for labs and classrooms.
